

HITCHHIKER'S CODE OF CONDUCT

1 Agreed is agreed

As soon as an inquiry is confirmed, both hitch-hikers will receive the other's contact details so they can make an arrangement. After the meeting place, time and payment for the driver have been agreed, they are regarded as being binding. If someone is prevented from taking up the shared journey, then they will contact the other hitch-hiker as quickly as possible. We recommend exchanging mobile phone numbers in case of emergencies.

2 Fair contribution to the driver

The passengers in the car will pay a contribution for petrol, car wear and tear and for example parking charges. In principle, the level and nature of the payment (money, coffee in the break, etc.) is a matter for the hitch-hikers. The driver and passengers can reach an agreement by email or telephone before the first trip.

At this point we are showing you an **example invoice** showing the possible components of the payment.

$$\frac{\textit{Payment}}{\textit{Number of persons}} = \frac{\textit{CHF 4.55} + \textit{CHF 0.10} / \textit{km} \times 50 \textit{km}}{2} = \frac{\textit{CHF 4.80} / \textit{trip}}{2}$$
